- JPI More Years Better Lives (MYBL): Labour Force Shortages within the Long-term Care Sector. The aim of the call is to promote an understanding of the different practical possibilities to alleviate the shortage of labour in long-term care, considering the importance of digitalisation. The applications were required to examine the theme from the perspective of both care providers and care recipients.
