as Social and Cultural Space. Changing Values and Representations

The object of analysis is the cultural significance of water. The project funded by the Academy of Finland (AKVA) asks:

- How do cultural discourses reflect the existential importance of water and how do our perceptions of water affect our approaches to water resources and the consumption of water in our every-day lives?
- 2. How is the spatial order of water constructed in cultural texts and how do imagined and real spaces function in a reciprocal relationship?
- What changes take place in the meanings, values, and images given to water and its textual and visual representations in time and space?
- 4. What are the cultural implications of technological innovations and what is the cultural role of water in times of transformation from the pre-modern to the modern and post-modern?

The objectives are:

- to increase knowledge of the large reservoir of symbols, metaphors and imagery based on water as one of the oldest cognitive systems of civilization
- 2. to promote cultural competence in the future management of sustainable water resources. One common focus will be on the geographical space of the Baltic Sea region as the "Northern" space of international collaboration
- **3.** to create a productive methodological dialogue between literary, language and cultural studies, historical and environmental studies, and engineering, in a synthesizing process.
