	The Academy of Finland acts as Finland's National Contact Point (NCP) for
	Horizon Europe together with Business Finland. The National Contact Point
	(NCP) responsibilities are divided between the Academy and Business Finland.
	The Academy has the main responsibility for Horizon Europe Pillar 1, Excellent
	Science, which includes the European Research Council (ERC). NCPs provide
	information, advice and training for potential applicants and their sites of
	research throughout project lifecycles.
	One form of training is the ERC Proposal Reading Day, when researchers
	planning to apply (primarily) and research support staff assisting them at sites
	of research get access to previously funded ERC applications. These
	applications are requested from volunteer researchers who have received ERC
	funding to a Finnish site. The processing of personal data is based on consent.
	The plan is to organise 1–3 Proposal Reading Days a year, using the same
	applications.
	The data will not be used for profiling and will not be subject to automated
	decision-making.
Data subjects and categories of	The data subjects are researchers who since 2014 (the beginning of the Horizon
personal data	2020 Framework Programme) have received ERC Starting Grant, Consolidator
	Grant or Advanced Grant funding to a Finnish site or research and who are
	contacted by the Academy by email concerning the possibility of submitting
	their applications to the ERC Proposal Reading Day. As a rule, the letter will be

	sent to all researchers who have received funding from the aforementioned calls.
	The personal data contained in the register are: 1) the recipient's (grantee/researcher) email address that was used to send the letter, and 2) the name of the grantee, the site of research, the call from which the application was funded; the panel in which the ERC application was reviewed and the title of the application, if the grantee submits the application to the Academy to be used at the ERC Proposal Reading Day. In addition, the applications submitted may contain other personal data insofar as they have not been deleted in advance from the applications submitted to the Academy.
Recipients or categories of recipients of the personal data	The data recipients are Proposal Reading Day participants: researchers who are planning to apply for ERC funding and who are based at Finnish sites of research as well as research support staff assisting the researchers at the sites. The participants will register for the event in advance and sign a non- disclosure agreement upon arrival.
	The data are disclosed only according to the duties and permissions granted in Finnish legislation. The right of public access is regulated under the Finnish Act on the Openness of Government Activities (621/1999). Public documents are disclosed according to sections 13 and 16 of the Act. An official document may be secret if it has been so provided. Secret official documents are disclosed only on the grounds of consent of the data subject, to a party, or due to a legal right.
Transferring personal data to a third country or international organisation	Data will not be transferred outside the European Union or the European Economic Area or to international organisations.
Period for which the personal data will be stored	Applications submitted for ERC Proposal Reading Days will be kept in paper form in the archives of the Academy of Finland and electronically for a period of five calendar years, unless the data subject withdraws their consent before that. The written letters of consent (emails) of the researchers who submitted their applications will also be stored electronically in the same place as the applications for five calendar years. The period is calculated from the beginning of the calendar year following the submission of the applications. The Finnish Archive Act (831/1994) regulates the archiving duties of authorities.
From which source the personal data originate if not obtained from the data subject	The personal data are obtained from the data subject. The personal data (name and email address) have been retrieved from the researchers'/universities' websites and from the Academy's own client register (SARA).
Rights of data subjects	Right of access to personal data
	The data subject has the right to obtain from the controller confirmation as to whether personal data concerning them are being processed, and, where that is the case, to obtain access to the personal data. On request, the controller shall provide a copy of the personal data undergoing processing. The request should be addressed to the contact person of the controller.



onc	vided that the data subject requests the above copy more frequently than e a year, the controller will charge a reasonable fee based on ninistrative costs.
Righ	at to rectification
dela	data subject has the right to obtain from the controller without undue by the rectification of inaccurate and incorrect personal data concerning n. The request should be addressed to the controller's contact person.
<u>Righ</u>	at to restrict processing
prod pers pers with con prot	data subject has the right to obtain from the controller a restriction of cessing, for example when the data subject contests the accuracy of the sonal data, for a period enabling the controller to verify the accuracy of the sonal data. Where processing has been restricted, such personal data shall, a the exception of storage, only be processed with the data subject's sent or for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims or for the ecction of the rights of another natural or legal person or for reasons of ortant public interest of the European Union or of an EU member state.

This right is without prejudice to other administrative appeal or I remedies.
